12. It has been suggested, that the Tot Lot and this newly acquired green space to the east should be joined together into one open space. This could be accomplished by closing the section of the alley between them. This would mean that the alley would have one entry/exit to the south at Washington Street. Representatives of Public Works have advised us that the alley is too long for garbage trucks to back up easily along the alley and the drivers would require a gate and access through this closed-off section of alley presumably three times a week for garbage collection. Fire trucks and emergency vehicles would not use the alley normally and are not an issue. It has been suggested that we could have a gate activated by a card, that when opened once a week, would block-off the park space from the alley and allow access for the garbage truck. The majority of the time, when the gate is closed, it would block-off the alley and join the park spaces together. It has also been suggested that we could use open pavers in this space that would allow grass to grow through but still could take the weight of the trucks three times a week. Considering the above, do you like the idea of closing the section of the alley between the Tot Lot and the newly acquired green space and making one continuous green space along Randolph?
