

## 2nd COMMUNITY MEETING for Scoville Park Site Plan

**Oak Park Public Library, 834 Lake Street in Oak Park**

Oak Park residents are invited to attend a community meeting to review site plan concepts and provide input regarding the current and future use of Scoville Park. Community input is vital to master plan development to ensure the Park District is meeting the current parks and recreation needs of the community, as well as anticipating future needs.

Scoville Park, widely regarded as our “Village Green,” was originally designed by noted landscape architect Jens Jensen and was named to the National Register of Historic Places in 2002. Within its nearly four acres lies three tennis courts, a playground and an open field used for summer concerts and special events. In the center of the park is the World War I Monument which is currently being restored. The southeast corner of the park features a replica of a fountain originally designed by sculptor Richard Bock and architect Frank Lloyd Wright. Through a partnership with the Village of Oak Park and the Oak Park Library, Grove Avenue was vacated in 2001 and a new plaza was constructed joining Scoville Park with the Library.
